





















Why do we have an evacuation?

We practise evacuations so that we can stay safe if there is an emergency at our school.





When are we practising the evacuation?

We are practising the evacuation on Thursday, it will be

before lunch.





The siren will ring continuously.





- We stop what we are doing.
- We listen to our teacher.
- We line up at the door.
- We walk outside and close the classroom door.
- We walk to the oval.
- All classes in the school will also be on the oval.
- We line up in two lines.
- My teacher will count us, to check we are all present.
- We stay quiet.
- The teacher will stay with us.
- We will go back to class when it is safe.



If I am outside, I calmly line up with my teacher. I will walk to the oval and line up where I am told.





If I am in MiniLit, or MaqLit, or Bond Blocks, the education assistant will walk me to the oval.

When we get to the oval, the education assistant will help me find my class and teacher.



If I am in the library, I will line up with my teacher.

We will walk to the oval and line up with the other classes.





Who is there to help?

A teacher or education assistant will be with you to help and keep you safe.



If I am with another teacher, or education assistant, they will look after me.
















The end of the evacuation
