

Year 6 Camp to Woodman Point, 2024

Dear Parents/Carers

As you are aware, our Year 6 students have the opportunity to attend an overnight Camp, at [Woodman Point Recreation Camp](#), 74 O'Kane Ct, Coogee.

The purpose of the year 6 camp is for the students to foster and develop independence, resilience, and social skills.

ACTIVITIES BEING CONDUCTED:

In small groups, students will participate in activities under the supervision of qualified sport and recreation staff including archery, geocaching (orienteering with GPS), search and rescue, rock climbing and vertical challenges.

Additionally, students will be participating in the following activities involving water: beach team building, paddling and raft building.

In the evening, students will participate in supervised activities under the direction of our teachers.

TRANSPORT:

- The students will leave Piara Waters Primary School on Wednesday 17 April at 9am by bus. Students must be at school by no later than 8:30am.
- The students will be returning, by bus, to Piara Waters Primary School on 19 April at 2:30pm.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATION:

Students will stay in the Woodman Point Recreational Camp dormitories. There will be a dorm for female students and a dorm for male students. All meals are included in the camp (breakfast, morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea, dinner), except for recess and lunch on the Wednesday, where students need to pack their own.

COST:

The cost of attending the Year 6 Camp is **\$240** per student. This includes transport, two nights accommodation, food and activities.

Please note that an amount of \$36.50 per student has been deducted because of the student fundraising (icy poles and concert night cooldrinks).

Payment is due by the Tuesday of Week 1, Term 2 (Tuesday 16 April) and can be made with one of the three payment options below. If this is an issue, please contact Joanne.Power@education.wa.edu.au to set up a payment plan.

CLOTHING AND THINGS TO PACK:

Students do not need to wear their school uniform at camp, it is optional. Students should wear comfortable clothes for the activities.

They will need to pack:

- Lunch and recess for Day 1 (Wednesday)
- Sleeping bag or sheets and blanket
- Shorts and t-shirts - at least 3 of each
- Pyjamas
- Warm clothing for evening
- Underwear – including socks
- Swimming attire (eg bathers, rashie)
- Two towels (beach and shower)
- Two pairs of enclosed shoes (one set for water activities)
- Hat
- Sunscreen
- Torch
- Toiletries (travel size will be sufficient) – washcloth, soap, shampoo, hairbrush, toothpaste, toothbrush, roll-on deodorant (no sprays)
- Water bottle (reusable)
- Day bag

Please DO NOT bring the following items:

- Portable devices including mobile phones, iPads, gaming consoles and cameras
- Money
- Jewellery
- Lollies or food
