Dear Parents and Carers

I trust you have enjoyed the school holidays with your children, and the wet weather didn't dampen plans. Below is a summary of what is on in Term 3 and more detailed information about this week.

We will continue to provide a weekly update, which will be published on Connect and our School Website in the <u>News</u> section. The <u>Calendar</u> and <u>Events</u> section of our school website is also a good way to keep up to date.

As our school continues to grow, we continue to expand our outdoor spaces for students to play and learn. During the school holidays, work was completed in the Wandjoo playground to provide additional seating areas for students.



Our school has received funding for two projects, which aim to enhance our outdoor environment further. Two state government election commitments which our students will benefit from, thanks to the Member for Oakford, Mr Yaz Mubarakai MLA, are;

- \$24,000 to build a covered gazebo. This space aims to provide more shelter from the elements during break times and a quiet space for small group work during class time, including for our neurodivergent students.
- \$250,000 to assist in the coverage of our basketball courts. Combined with a school contribution and P&C donation, this will enable us to provide cover over the courts, increasing their usage during extreme and wet weather and ensuring our students can always be sun-smart.

Over the holidays, our fabulous Science teachers presented three sessions at the annual national Australian Science Teachers' Conference (ConASTA). There was much interest in how we teach Science at our school and the programs we offer. Thank you to Ms Ram, Mrs Steel, Miss Kearney, Ms Boyd and Mrs Padua for giving up time on your holidays to contribute to this conference.



A highlight for the junior and senior choirs was their outstanding performance at the **WA Government School's Music Society Concert** at Crown Theatre in June. The Minister's Running Challenge is on again! The running challenge is a health and fitness campaign to encourage and promote physical activity and well-being among children.

Over nine weeks (Monday, 21 July, to Friday, 19 September, Term 3), Kindergarten to year six students are encouraged to engage in at least 20 minutes of physical exercise or running per week – in order to log 200 minutes of activity.
