Dear Parents and Carers

It was fabulous to see our students return to school on Wednesday and to welcome our 53 new Pre-Primary to Year 6 students. A big thank you to our amazing students, who always make new students feel welcome and help them settle into our school.

We also had the pleasure of supporting our new Kindergarten students as they commenced their first day of school last week. Thank you, parents, for already teaching your children to independently put their water bottle, crunch and sip and lunch in the right places and get ready for the school day.



A number of students need to bring in their stationary items. We understand that these are probably on order. We have a very minimal "booklist," but it is essential that students always have their complete set of equipment.

NAPLAN (YEAR 3 AND 5 STUDENTS)

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students undertake.

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national proficiency standards. NAPLAN is just one aspect of our school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it provides us with additional information about our students' educational progress.

NAPLAN is held across Australia at the same time. This year, it will be between the 4th and 23rd of March. You can find more information on our <u>school website</u> and the <u>NAPLAN website</u>. Prior to the 4th of March, our year 3 and 5 students will undertake some practice assessments so that they can become familiar with the test process and online platform.


WEEK 2 EVENTS

MONDAY 10 FEBRUARY

MACQLIT READING INTERVENTION GROUPS


MacqLit small group reading Intervention groups re-commence today for years 4-6. These groups continue from last year and provide students with extra assistance to develop essential reading skills. Parents will be informed if new students are identified to join the program.

WHOLE SCHOOL APPROACH TO HOME READING (Year 1-6)

We cannot stress enough the importance of reading. Improved vocabulary, critical thinking and analytical skills, and focus and concentration are just some benefits of reading. Therefore, we have a whole-school approach to promoting and ensuring that PWPS students read at least four times a week.

Today, all students from Pre-primary to year six will bring home a Piara Waters Primary School Reading Log, which they will use to record their home reading. (Kindergarten students will commence home reading in the coming months.)

All students are expected to read at home. Classroom teachers will either provide books for home reading or provide information on what books to read (e.g., books from the library).





Students should read for up to 20

minutes four times a week. Home reading should be recorded in your child's reading log. Four times a week is the minimum number of times students need to read. However, we know many of our students can read more often, so this year's Reading Log has space to record up to seven nights per week.

Please remind your child to **bring their reading log to school every Monday** so their classroom teacher can check and stamp it.

Students who read 200 or more nights in a year will receive a badge, and they can earn many other certificates and goldie awards along the way!

TUESDAY 11 FEBRUARY

YEAR 5/6 PUBLIC SPEAKING EXTENSION GROUP AUDITIONS

Year 5 and 6 students who have nominated for a place in our Public Speaking Extension Program will audition today. Auditions will take place during period 2, in the drama room with Mrs Walton.

SAFER INTERNET DAY (Year 3-6)

Safer Internet Day is a global initiative to raise awareness of online safety issues.

The eSafety Commissioner leads the initiative in Australia. They educate people about online safety risks, such as abuse, how to be safe online, and where to go for help.

Students in Years 3 to 6 may watch a webinar hosted by the eSafety Commission this week. This year's topic is safe and positive gaming with others.




WEDNESDAY 12 FEBRUARY
