#### **INFORMATION**

#### **EXTREME HOT WEATHER**

Recently, we have all experienced the extreme heat that has impacted Perth. When this happens, we will put measures in place to keep our students and staff as comfortable as possible. Well done to the students for adapting to our changed arrangements for recess and lunch. A special mention to the year four students who went to "Lego Land" in the drama room and played together with the most impeccable teamwork and co-operation.

On extreme heat days, just like we did on Thursday and Friday, the arrangements will be;

- Encouraging students to refill their water bottles regularly.
- Students should "slip, slop, slap" before school and reapply with our bottles of sunscreen that are in every classroom.
- Physical education lessons will be in the air-conditioned undercover area, or students will "talk sport" in classrooms. Year 4, 5 and 6 year level sport/ summer carnival practice will be cancelled.
- Students do not go outside to eat or for recess and lunch. This means K and P students stay in their classrooms at recess and lunch. Year 1-3 students access activities inside the drama and music room, block 2, library and undercover at recess and remain in their classrooms at lunchtime. The year 4-6 students stay in their classrooms at recess and access the activities in the drama and music, block 2, library and undercover area at lunch.
- Vigorous activities are postponed.
- Short breaks, which students require, are in the shade.
- Continue to keep lunchboxes and water bottles inside the classroom
- On Fridays.... Icy poles will be on sale!

On days when it is hot, but not extreme, all water bottles and lunchboxes continue to be kept inside the classrooms. Students are encouraged to play in the shade and to utilise the sunscreen which is available in every classroom. Physical education lessons are modified and quiet activities are available in some indoor and the shaded areas at recess and lunch.





## ON-ENTRY ASSESSMENT (PRE-PRIMARY TO YEAR 1)

Over the next four weeks, Pre-primary and year 1 students will be participating in the state-wide *On-entry Assessment Program*. It is a requirement that all Pre-primary students undertake the assessment. We also choose to participate in the year one assessment, which is optional for schools.



During this time, Pre-primary and year one teachers will spend one-on-one time with each student in their class to find out about their literacy and numeracy skills and understandings. The teacher will use this information to plan and target teaching programs to suit each child's learning needs. During the assessment, a relief teacher will teach the class.

The literacy assessment tasks for Pre-primary students include:

- Speaking and listening engage in conversation
- Reading recognise rhyming words, identify the sounds in letters and words, listen and respond to questions about stories read to them.
- Writing draw a picture and attempt to write their name and words about their picture.

## The numeracy tasks tasks for Pre-primary students include:

- Number identify, count and match small quantities and numbers
- Measurement compare length and weight by observing and touching the objects
- Geometry identify shapes and simple 'position' words.

## The literacy assessment tasks for Year 1 students include:

- Speaking and listening engage in conversation
- Reading recognise rhyming words, identify the sounds in letters and words, listen and respond to questions about stories read to them and attempt to read a story book.
- Writing attempting to write a simple story.

#### The numeracy tasks for Year 1 students include:

- Number recognise numbers, patterns, match and count by ones and twos; simple addition and subtraction story problems; copy and continue a pattern.
- Measurement compare length by observing, read and set times.
- Geometry show understanding of shapes and simple 'position' words.

Parents will be given a summary of their child's results towards the end of the term. These summaries provide an overview of your child's responses to questions and tasks completed during the assessment and include some ideas about how you can help your child at home.

Students selected to participate in the Mathematics Extension program for year 2 to 6 will be notified this week. In 2024, students have been selected if they received an A in mathematics number in semester 2, 2023 and achieved in the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile (or above) on the PAT maths test. They will also commence their extension lessons this week.



Pre-primary students will be bringing home their Reading Log this week. Pre-primary students will use the reading logs to record the reading/comprehension packs that are also being sent home today.




## **TUESDAY 13 FEBRUARY**

All year, 4/5/6 students are welcome. After a few weeks, we will ask students to decide if they want to remain in the choir.




## **WEDNESDAY 14 FEBRUARY**
