COMPASS PARENT INFORMATION AND 'HOW TO' SESSIONS

We will be holding information and 'how-to' Compass sessions for parents this week in the school library. Parents are invited to attend the Tuesday afternoon (2.00 pm—2.30 pm) or Friday morning (8:30 am—9:00 am) session.

These sessions will be helpful, if you need any assistance logging into Compass and how to use the platform for your child.

Compass allows PWPS parents to:

- monitor their child's attendance
- enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- view your child's timetable and school calendar
- provide consent for some school events, such as excursions and incursions
- view documented plans / IEPs for identified students (we are progressively uploading these)
- view information about your child attending the sick bay

You do not need to RSVP, just turn up! Bring your device if you can!

All parents have been emailed login details for Compass. If you have misplaced this email, please get in touch with the front office, or we can sort it for you at one of these sessions.

UNEXPLAINED ABSENCES

The School Education Act requires that you let us know as soon as possible that your child will be absent from school, what their likely date of return is, and the reason why.

This year, we have introduced the Compass software, which makes it easy for parents to see any

unexplained absences, provide reasons for them, advise of future absences, and track their child's attendance and any times they have been late to school.

Preferred ways of communicating an absence:

- Enter the reason for past absences (unexplained absences) or advise us of future absences into <u>Compass</u>. (See the support sheet attached to this Connect notice)

As indicated on previous school calendars, on Wednesday, April 2nd, the **school will close at 11:30 a.m. to allow** parent/teacher interviews to take place.


We will hold Parent and Teacher interviews from 12 pm- 5 pm.

We ask that you arrange to collect your children from school at 11:30 am, have them walk/scoot/ride home, or organise supervision through <u>OSH Club</u>. If this is not possible, please notify the front office so we can put alternative arrangements in place for your child.

Interviews will be held in classrooms. Each interview time slot is 12 minutes. If you need to arrange more than one interview, we suggest you do not book interviews back-to-back. Leaving a space between each interview will enable you to get to the next classroom, and not use up any of your interview time.

Specialist teachers, the deputy principals and I, and all classroom teachers can be booked for interviews.

SCIENCE EXTENSION PROGRAM FOR YEARS 3,4,5,6

Interested Year 3, 4,5 and 6 students can apply to participate in the Science Extension Program. The extension classes will take place in term 2 and 3, on Fridays between 8am and 9:30am.

Students will learn about scientists and their discoveries. Then, they will work on student-led group investigations. Over the course, students will have the opportunity to research, plan, and conduct investigations. To conclude, students will present their findings and reflections.

Completed projects will be showcased in our school during the Science Showcase Evening. Up to 10 of the best projects from each session will be submitted to the <u>Science Talent Search 2025</u>.

All Year 3, 4, 5, and 6 students can apply. The forms are due back to the front office by Thursday, 27 March 2025. You can download the form or get one from your science teacher, who will share this information in class this week.

Year 1 and 2 students will also have the opportunity to enter a submission in the SSTAWA Science Talent Search Competition. Students will undertake the work as part of their science lesson, and in term 3, those students who are excelling will be provided additional time to complete their submission.


MONDAY 17 MARCH

students will return to class at 8:15 a.m., and Year 2 students will return to class at 8:30 a.m. this week.






