Dear parents and carers

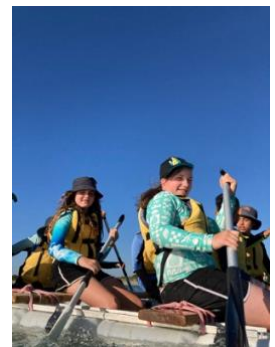


I trust you have enjoyed the school holidays with your children. Our year 3 and 6 students had a particularly fabulous end to term 1.

RUNNING CLUB (Kindy – Year 6, before school)

All Kindergarten to year 6 students are invited to attend Running Club on the school oval on Tuesdays in term 2 and term 3 between 7:45 and 8:15 a.m.

Teachers will provide students with their QR code to count their laps on Monday. Students are encouraged to keep this in their school bag.

Students will earn a faction point for each lap completed and may also aim to join our “100 club” if they run 100 laps, “200 club” if they run 200 laps or even “300 club” if they run 300 laps over the two terms.

Parents and siblings are also welcome to join in. There is no need to sign up; just come along when you can!

This year, we will have two iPads per faction to scan student bar codes each lap. There will be a K-2 and a 3-6 iPad. Students must go to the correct iPad, or their laps won't be recorded. K-2 students have a bright **orange** QR lap card (and the K-2 lap scanner will be wearing an **orange** volunteer vest). Year 3-6 students have a white QR lap code and will be scanned by someone NOT in an orange vest.

Due to the expansion of students running, we also need 8 volunteers each week to help with the barcode scanning. Volunteers are required between 7:45 am and 8:15 am each Tuesday.

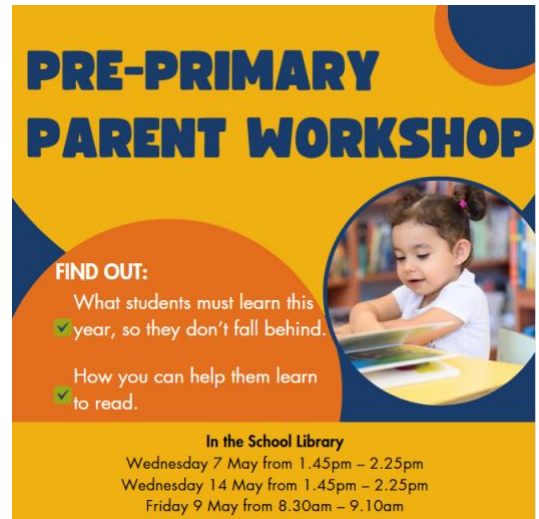
PRE-PRIMARY HISTORY INCURSION

PAT GRAMMAR AND PUNCTUATION ASSESSMENT

All students in Year 3 - 6 will complete the PAT Grammar and Punctuation assessment during Week 3, from **Monday 12 May – Friday 16 May**. These tests are designed to assist teachers in their assessment of student's understanding of the Standard Australian English language conventions of grammar and punctuation and will provide valuable data for planning at an individual, classroom and whole school level.

Students do not need to be concerned about this test and no preparation is required.

ACARA ITEM TRIAL 2025 – TESTING NAPLAN QUESTIONS

PWPS is one of approximately 400 schools to be selected by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) to participate in this year's Item Trial. The purpose of the Item Trial is to evaluate potential NAPLAN test questions ('items') for use in future NAPLAN tests. Your child's involvement and the results from the trial will help ACARA ensure that NAPLAN tests are valid, reliable and fair for all students.

About the Item Trial

- The Item Trial is about testing the **questions**, not about testing your child or their ability. Your child's results will not be reported.
- Tests being trialled are Reading, Numeracy, Conventions of Language and Writing.
- Selected students will sit two Item Trial tests.
- The tests will be administered at the school by external invigilators on **28 May and 29 May**.

Students for the Item Trial testing will be selected from:

- Year 3 – **Room 30, Room 31, Room 34 and Room 36**
- Year 5 – **Room 10 and Room 11**

Further information will be provided to families of the selected students closer to the time.

NATIONAL SIMULTANEOUS STORYTIME – DRESS UP (ALL K-6 STUDENTS)

JUNE

READING AWARD CEREMONIES

All students should be recording home reading in their Reading Logs at least four times each week. Before bringing their Reading Logs to school to be checked by their teacher each Monday, it is their responsibility to update the total number of days they have recorded this year.

Home reading milestones are recognised at either a classroom or school level throughout the year.

- 10 days – 1 Gold tokens from the class teacher
- 50 days – 5 Gold tokens from the class teacher
- 100 days – a Certificate of Achievement from the principal (and 10 Gold tokens)
- 150 days – a Certificate of Excellence from the principal (and 15 Gold tokens)
- 200 days – a Remarkable Reader Certificate and pin from the principal

Many students reached the 50 days home reading in Term 1 and are on track to achieve the 100-day milestone in Term 2.

Reading Recognition Ceremonies will be held on **Wednesday, 4 June, and Tuesday, 1 July**, from 2:00pm – 2:30pm in the library. Parents and caregivers are welcome to attend.

FACTION CROSS COUNTRY CARNIVAL (YEAR 1 – YEAR 6 STUDENTS)

On **Friday, 27 June**, all Year 1 to 6 students compete in their year levels / gender to run their cross-country race around the school, earning points for their faction. The top 10 students from each race receive a certificate, and the top 2 students receive a Champion and Runner Up medal presented to them at the presentations. The top placed runners in year 3 to 6 will be selected for our Interschool Cross Country team in term 3.



The students run the following distances:

- Year 1 and 2: 780m
- Year 3: 1km
- Year 4: 1.4km
- Year 5 and 6: 1.8km



INTERSCHOOL WINTER CARNIVAL (YEAR 5 AND 6 STUDENTS)

Year 5 and 6 students have had the opportunity to try out and train for the Interschool Winter carnival that will be held on **Monday 30 June**.

Students who log their reading each week automatically enter the draw to win a prize. There are more than 200 weekly prizes, including tech gadgets, book vouchers, and e-gift cards.

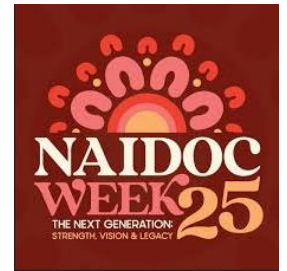


JULY
