TRAFFIC WARDEN – RELIEF WORK

Students and families are supported to cross Wright Road safely before and after school by a traffic warden. There are occasions when the traffic warden assigned to our school is unavailable, sometimes at short notice, and the Traffic Warden branch does not have the resources to cover these absences.



Would you be interested in becoming a relief traffic warden for our school, or would you be available on a regular basis should the position become available in the future?

The WA Police Force employs Traffic Wardens on a casual basis. To become a traffic warden, you need to:

- Have access to email
- Have a full driving license and access to a vehicle
- Be available to work an hour in the morning and an hour in the afternoon
- Complete and submit an application to Children's Crossings Unit

Congratulations to Harvey S, Aston E, Tate F and Beau O, who have now run 100 laps and received 100 Club certificates at the Junior Assembly.





READING LOGS


KINDERGARTEN TO YEAR 6 BOOK FAIR - LIBRARY
